

APPLICATION PROCESS

Students must have a GED or high school diploma to apply for Practical Nursing Program. Students must be 18 years of age by the time the NCLEX exam is taken.

Requirements:

- Completed application for PN Program
- High school transcript to verify graduation or GED Certificate with test score
- Pre-entrance testing (fee required) consists of aptitude, interest, basic academic skills
- Record of employment and health education
- References

Application Process:

Applications are available from the end of March until the testing date.

PRACTICAL NURSING

The Practical Nursing program is designed for adults who want a challenging career full of opportunities. As a practical nurse you will work under the supervision or direction of a registered nurse, licensed physician or dentist. Opportunities are abundant and predicted to grow.

The High Plains Technology Center Practical Nursing program is approved by the Oklahoma Board of Nursing. Upon satisfactory completion of the program, graduates receive a diploma and school pin. They are then eligible to make application to take the National Council Licensure examination for Licensure (NCLEX) as a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).

COURSE CONTENT

Classes meet Monday through Thursday for 1,526 hours of classroom and clinical instruction including 582 hours of theory, 119 hours of lab skills and 825 hours of clinical experience.

PROGRAM EXPENSES

Financial aid information may be obtained in the Student Services office. It is the student's responsibility to handle the initial financial obligations of deposit and tuition. Continuing financial assistance is contingent upon satisfactory grades, progress toward a diploma and satisfactory attendance.

After students are notified of acceptance, a \$50 deposit is required to reserve student's place in the program.
